

## “Wilkie’s Syndrome: Case Report”

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Superior Mesenteric Artery or Wilkie Syndrome is a rare cause of duodenal obstruction and results from compression of the third portion of the duodenum by the superior mesenteric artery and the aortic artery.

This diagnosis is being made more frequently due to the advancement of diagnostic tests, in the detection of this syndrome that affects patients and often are not diagnosed correctly and are treated for other diseases while

having Wilkie's syndrome. This rare syndrome should be remembered mainly in patients with nausea, postprandial abdominal pain, early satiety and weight loss. In these cases, the correct diagnosis really does make a difference and most likely there will be more and more patients who demand this type of surgery. Robotic duodenojejunostomy is a practical option to treat Wilkie's syndrome. It provides definitive treatment with the advantages and benefits of minimally invasive surgery.
